In the beginning, some people deny the existence of God but later introduce divine messengers and representatives as the most successful individuals. These individuals are invited to establish a special and continuous relationship with God. Then, at the height of the call to prayer (adhan) and its establishment (iqamah), it is recommended to all classes and communities to change their lives towards success and progress and to move swiftly in this direction. A key and effective program for achieving success is presented, which is "to strive to perform the best deeds." Furthermore, it is mentioned that God is greater than other influential factors in life, and ultimately, all false gods except for Allah are negated.

Imam Abu Ja'far (peace be upon him) narrated from Zararah and Faza'il ibn Yasar that when the Prophet of God (peace be upon him) ascended to the heavens and reached the Beit al-Mamoor, it was time for prayer. Gabriel called the adhan and iqamah, and the Prophet moved forward while the angels and prophets lined up behind him. They asked him how he had called the adhan, and he explained: "God is the greatest influencing factor in life and success, and I bear witness that there is nothing greater than Him in this regard." He also bears witness that Muhammad (peace be upon him) is the first successful person. He calls people towards prayer, which is the best way to connect with God, and also towards success and the best deeds, emphasizing that God is the greatest influencing factor in life and success. In the end, the Prophet (peace be upon him) instructs Bilal to call the adhan, and he continues to do so until the Prophet's life is taken.

Islam is a religion that emphasizes success and progress.

Success means the maximal flourishing of the talents that God has bestowed upon individuals and communities. This concept represents the maximal realization of divine plans throughout life. Misery signifies a failure to utilize these talents properly or the realization of satanic agendas. Those who succeed do so because God has guided them.
